## Large print labels



Large print copies of the text labels are available in the gallery. The text is 20-point and printed on yellow paper.

There is a folder of large print labels for each section of the exhibition. They are stored in clear plastic holders, which are fixed to the walls.

You can take the folders with you as you move around the gallery. Please replace them after you have finished so other visitors can use them.

Magnifying glasses and fold out stools are available for you to borrow as you move around the exhibition. They can be collected near the entrance to the exhibition. Please replace them after you have finished so other visitors can use them.





## Interactives and audio-visual content

Throughout the exhibition there are things you can interact with.

There is a vintage horse ride. It is suitable for children aged 3-12 to use with adult supervision. It costs £1 to use the ride. The machine is operated by inserting a £1 coin.



The ride moves vigorously and makes a loud noise. It only moves when it is being used. It makes a noise at regular intervals, so you might hear it throughout the gallery.




There is a film which plays the openings of a selection of children's television programmes from the 1970s. It lasts for 11 minutes.

The audio is played through two sets of headphones. The film has subtitles.

There are stools you can sit on while you watch/ listen to the film.

There is a cartoon workshop area. It has a film of the artist Pete McKee demonstrating how to draw different characters.



The audio for the film is played through the television speakers, so you might hear it in other areas of the gallery. The film has subtitles. There are 4 tutorials, which each last 5 minutes.

Paper and pencils are on the desks for you to use.

There are different sizes of desks and seats available to use. The lower-level desks have chairs. The higher-level desks have stools.







There is a Space Invaders arcade game to play.

The game is operated by pushing buttons. It is free to use.

There are plastic step stools next to the machine that can be used to help reach the controls.

There is a podcast which includes the artist Pete McKee talking about his favourite songs and extracts from the songs.

The audio is played through two sets of headphones.


There are stools you can sit on while you listen.



There is an area with sofas and televisions.

There are 2 televisions, each playing a different film. Each television is positioned next to a sofa you can sit on.

The audio is played through headphones. Each television has two sets of headphones.

The making of 'Little Pete' lasts for 4 minutes. The film has subtitles.
