

Welcome to Kelham Island Museum







Kelham Island Museum is in an area called Kelham Island, on the edge of Sheffield city centre.





There are two accessible parking bays close to the entrance of the museum.






There is a level path from the accessible car parking to the museum entrance.



Accessible toilets are in the building opposite the entrance. The café (Joni) is also in this building.




This is the entrance to the museum. It is free to enter and you will not need a ticket.

Some areas of the museum are noisy because there is working machinery. There are also uneven floors and some dark areas.




The Little Mesters area of the museum has very uneven floors.







The floor in the River Don Engine room is sloping. When the engine is running it is very noisy.
